Best practices for making the most of your Spark subscription

For organizations looking for instructional consistency and more efficient workflows, Lumio's Spark plan offers a library to house approved curriculum content, as well as the ability for teachers to collaborate on content for increased productivity with minimal effort.

Spark Implementation Roadmap:

Follow these steps to successfully get started with your Spark implementation

PLAN AND PREPARE

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What are your goals for the Spark plan? How will you evaluate success? Who should help with implementation?

EMPOWER CORE TEAM

Ensure the members of your implementation team have the opportunities to fully experience the Spark plan, through clear role definition, training, and time to plan.

APPLY AND REFLECT

As the core team uses the organization and shared libraries to house and share content, consider what is working well and what new practices you could create to better utilize these tools.

EXPAND YOUR IMPLEMENTATION

What are the next groups of educators in your organization to include in your implementation of the Spark plan? How will you gather their feedback? How will you support continuous growth?

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Review current Spark features:

Shared Libraries:

- Each Spark user can create up to **five** Shared Libraries
- Non-Spark users can be viewers or editors of a Shared Library, but they cannot create or manage Shared Libraries
- Library **admin** and **editors** can **co-edit** lessons in a Shared Library

Organization Libraries:

- Larger shared library that every Spark user in a district has access to (no member limit)
- Allows for easy sharing of approved curriculum content
- Members are managed via the Admin Portal
- Allowing viewers to **contribute content** can be toggled on or off

Shared and Organization Library Roles:

	Shared Libraries	Organization Libraries
Admin	Library creator and owner. Manages library settings, adds members and sets member roles	Manages library settings within . Can allow viewers to submit content.
Editor	Adds, organizes, and edits content	
Viewer	Views content, can save content to their My Library or a Shared Library they have edit access to. Can submit content to an Organization Library if setting is enabled.	

LMS Integration

Add the Lumio app in <u>Canvas</u>, <u>Schoology</u>, or <u>D2L Brightspace</u> to provide a seamless experience for teachers and students. Teachers and students can access Lumio from the Canvas, Schoology, or D2L Brightspace platforms.

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APPLY AND REFLECT

As the core team uses the organization and shared libraries to house and share content, consider what is working well and what new practices you could create to better utilize these tools.

Ideas to try as you use Organization and Shared Libraries

Pick a content area and/or grade level. Add Lumio lessons to the appropriate folders in the Organization Library for that area and grade.
Build Lumio lessons to help students prepare for state assessments. Add these to your Organization Library for teacher use. <u>Find ideas here</u> .
Develop or collect a repository of entrance and exit ticket activities in a folder in your Organization Library. <u>Find ideas here</u> .
Add a folder to your Organization Library to house district-wide emergency sub plans.
Gather Lumio activities incorporating instructional strategies for <u>English</u> <u>Language Learners</u> . Add to a folder in your Organization Library. <u>Find</u> ideas for other instructional strategies here.
Create a Shared Library for instructional leaders who conduct professional development. Share common training files. <u>Find ideas for using Lumio to lead professional development here</u> .
Use a Shared Library as a sandbox for lessons your department might consider adding to the Organization Library.
Create a Shared Library for a content area you support. Add members to Shared Library. Add your favorite Lumio lessons to the Shared Library.
